Jeff is a well-known and avid Sea-Run Cutthroat fisher, fly developer and fly tier who lives in Quilcene, Washington on Northern Hood Canal. One of his articles, "In a Winter Wonderland," is featured in the 2018 winter issue of Fly Fishing and Tying Journal.

Fishing is for all skill levels. If you are new to steelheading, indicator rigs are the way to go. Plenty of gravel bars and easy wading make for great opportunities for swinging flies for those who like to test their spey or switch rod skills. Either way you won't be disappointed.
